Riverstone Wesleyan has a matching scholarship for which you may apply if you regularly attended Riverstone as your main church, are walking in faith with Christ, and will be attending an approved Christian college.

The Riverstone Wesleyan Church Scholarship is a local church scholarship that will be between \$200-\$500 depending on the number of applicants for the year and will often be matched by the college. This scholarship is for those entering or currently attending an approved Christian college and will be considered for renewal by a new application each year for up to 4 years.

To apply, please fill out the attached application in its entirety and return it to the church office. It must be received by April 20th. Applications received after the deadline above will not receive priority.

RIVERSTONE WESLEYAN CHURCH COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP POLICY

(revised @ 11/06 LLC Mtg.)

- 1) The Avon Wesleyan Church shall establish and maintain a college scholarship fund.
- 2) The program shall provide scholarship amount per year for up to four years per student at all Wesleyan Denominational Colleges and at Roberts Wesleyan College, as well as other Christian colleges as approved by the LBA. The amount shall still be given in American dollars if the student is in a Canadian school that qualifies in other ways. The amounts that the various schools will match are different. Some presently are \$750 per year and some are \$500. The amount of matching scholarship given will be the same for each student even if their schools matching fund level is less.
- 3) These amounts shall be evaluated yearly as the fund builds to possibly increase the amounts or include other Christian colleges.
- 4) A student must take a minimum of 12 hours.
- 5) A student must have consistently attended Avon Wesleyan Church services for at least 2 years and Avon Wesleyan Church must be their primary place of worship.
- 6) A student must enter college within three years of high school graduation. The scholarship does not apply to adults returning to school.
- 7) No economic criteria apply. The scholarship will be given regardless of need.
- 8) No academic criteria applies other than the school's required standard to continue attendance. As long as the student maintains the minimum grade point average the school requires, the student is eligible.
- 9) Eligibility shall be reconsidered yearly to ensure that eligibility requirements are maintained.
- 10) Special cases will be considered by the LBA upon the recommendation of the pastor.
- 11) The entire amount shall be given before the first semester or as required by the particular school.
- 12) The fund shall begin to accumulate money in the spring of 1993 and shall begin to disburse funds in the fall of 1993.
- 13) The pastors shall review the applications received and, if they feel it is necessary, interview the students concerning their eligibility.
- 14) Qualified students shall then be recommended to the LBA for approval by the February LBA meeting if possible so that the various schools can be notified in February.
- 15) Some schools need to be notified by early March for inclusion of money in their financial aid packages.
- 16) The scholarship fund shall be self sustained in an interest bearing account. A special offering for this fund may be taken such as a part of the Easter Offering or at the time of high school graduations as decided by the LBA.
- 17) Parents and friends of students need to be aware of the restrictions concerning not being able to designate or channel money to a particular student through this fund. A person can donate to this fund but cannot designate money nor increase money to a particular student either to increase matching funds or to get a tax deduction for student expenses for that student.
- 18) The fund could be promoted by compiling a list of alumni from these schools to use in some way in helping to promote the fund.
